Please start to put aside any items you may have for our Parish Flea Market. Due to our lack of storage space, however, we ask that you do not bring any of these items to the hall until Sunday, October 22.

You can bring items such as:

Electronics: Please be sure that you include any power cords that are required and attach them to the item; (do not worry about batteries which we can provide); If your item requires a disk to make it work (such as a printer), please provide the disk.

Tools: They sell very well

Appliances: Please be sure that you include any power cords that are required by the item. Old appliances sell well if they work. If they are broken, please do not bring them. It would be appreciated if the item was clean from kitchen

Clothing, Bedding, and Rugs: Used clothes are not our best sellers, but we do accept them. Please be sure that they are not filthy or torn. Pillows, sheets and blankets also sell if they are not torn or stained. We accept small area rugs as well.

Jewelry: These are good sellers but, do not expect gold jewelry to be sold at gold prices - remember, this is a flea market, we take whatever is our best offer (usually well below what an item is worth).

Art, Posters, Frames, and Mirrors: We accept these as well, but empty picture frames do not sell well.

Household items: Sometimes dishes and glasses sell well and sometimes they do not, but we certainly accept them. Sets of fine China and crystal will be sold with ordinary dinnerware, as most people are not interested in quality items these days. We accept clean pots and pans as well.

Toys: These sell well if they are not broken.

Seasonal decorations: Christmas and other seasonal decorations items sell if they are not broken.

Books, Records, CD's/DVD's: These items usually sell

NO bulky furniture please: Most who come to the flea market do not have trucks to transport large, bulky items.
